ACTIVITIES & HIGHLIGHTS

PERLASCA EXHIBITION

The exhibition of work by Mexican American artist Dina Perlasca opened with an artist talk and reception on June 16. Her exhibition, titled *Campos de Fuerza / Force Fields*, presents sculptural installations that tie together her ancestral background with ideas around community cohesion and will run through August 27. A second recent MFA graduate exhibition by artist Juana Estrada Hernández will open in September.

PLANETARIUM SUMMER ACTIVITIES

Space Jam was featured on June 2 for Movies Under the Moon, an outdoor movie program outside the planetarium. The Iron Giant will be screened on July 28. June's Second Saturday had a Planetarium-focus with hands-on activities, including kaleidoscopes and giant bubbles, and solar viewing in the courtyard, and planetarium shows focusing on the history of planetariums, fractals and the development of the telescope. Both programs were made possible by the RMAC Foundation.

A model rocket camp will be held in July for children in grades 3 through 6.

HOLIDAY ARTISAN MARKET CALL

A call for artists and craftspeople in New Mexico and surrounding states for the 2023 Holiday Artisan Market is open through August 4. Presented in partnership with the Pecos Valley Potters Guild, the Market is a juried art exhibit, sale and fundraiser held at the Roswell Museum representing up to 50 artists in all media from around the region. The event will run from November 11 through December 31. Visit www.roswellmuseum. org for further details.

UFO FESTIVAL

Tickets continue to be on sale for three activities presented by the Museum as part of the 2023 UFO Festival, including an Alien Crazy Hair Salon with support by the RMAC Foundation, Goddard Planetarium Laser Shows, and the concert From Bartók to Webern: Classical

& Experimental Music of the 1930s & 1940s with the Giovanni String Quartet, sponsored by the Roswell Symphony Orchestra. Visit www.roswellmuseum.org for further details.

MUSEUM DAY ROSWELL

Plans are in development a new event titled Museum Day Roswell, a free museum day to encourage exploration of our local museums, inspired by International Museum Day and a national version developed by the Smithsonian. Each participating venue will offer different activities from hands-on art to scavengers hunts, tours and a flight simulator experience. A raffle will be offered with a passport activity for those that visit each venue.

CHALK THE WALK

Chalk the Walk, a popular sidewalk chalk art contest that has been held intermittently at the Museum since 2006, will be a standalone event this year during September 9th's Second Saturday. Artists, as individuals or teams, kids and adults, will draw with provided chalk pastel in designated squares in front of the Museum along the Spring River Trail from 8 a.m. through 1 p.m. Squares can be reserved for \$10 to \$15 and scholarships and a free draw area will be provided. MARTIE ZELT

Local artist Martie Zelt passed away on May 11. She had a prolific career in the arts, including teaching numerous workshops and as an instructor at the Pennsylvania Academy and Philadelphia College of Art. She has been represented in solo and group exhibitions and in the permanent collection at the Roswell Museum, as well as at several institutions in South America and The U.S. She first participated in the Roswell Artist-in-Residence Program in 1982 and returned for a second residency in 1989, after which she stayed in Roswell and taught at ENMU-R and the Roswell Museum. She designed and created a mosaic mural for the Civic Center after it was built, recruiting local people to help. She then

recruited members of the Pecos Valley Potters Guild and the Roswell Museum's Ceramics Program to help her create a tile mural for Bitter Lake National Wildlife Refuge depicting animal habitats. She will be deeply missed. A memorial exhibition will open in a few weeks, details to be announced online.

BUILDING RENOVATIONS AND REPAIRS

Bids were submitted for the Museum Flooring Renovation in late May and an award recommendation will be taken to City Council in July. The project will update and repair flooring in public spaces to improve air quality, accessibility, maintenance, and appearance. The project is estimated to require 4 months between July and October to complete, during which it is anticipated that portions of the museum will be under construction, while other areas remain open. The auditorium will be used for storage during the renovation and will be unavailable for meetings and events.

City monies were retracted for the exterior signage project, although planning will continue to enable implementation when monies become available. The project aims to help visibility for the Museum at two points on the building: Main Street and the Planetarium.

Ongoing:

- Multiple existing HVAC units have had issues in recent months. Quotes are being gathered for repairs.
 A replacement unit has been on order for the planetarium for more than a year. Date of installation is anticipated soon.
- The audio system in the auditorium is malfunctioning and the system is in need of repairs and updates.
- The design of the entrance fountains are under evaluation to determine if modifications can be made. They are currently not running.
