RECENT MUSEUM ACTIVITIES & HIGHLIGHTS

TEMPORARY CLOSURE & CURRENT HOURS

Due to public health orders, the Museum closed to the general public from November 17 to December 3, reopening again on Friday, December 4. RMAC is continuing to maintain reduced hours based on current resources of Tuesday - Friday, 1-5 pm.

MUSEUMS FOR ALL

Admission fees to the museum will begin in the new year on January 5. As part of the Museum's goal to maintain accessibility and reach underserved communities, RMAC has joined a national program called Museums for All through which RMAC pledges to provide a discounted admission fee of \$3.00 to participants in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). SNAP is a federal program that helps millions of low-income Americans put food on the table. It is the largest program working to fight hunger in America.

Discounts will also be available for Roswell residents, student, military and seniors, along with free days for seniors and residents. Admission for children ages 15 and under will be free.

COLLECTIONS

RMAC is the proud recipient of a recent donation by Las Cruces sculptor Rachel Stevens. The 16 ft. tall metal sculpture, titled *Jacob's Ladder*, recently arrived and will be the latest addition to the Museum's sculpture courtyard. As some assembly will be required, the artist will make a return visit to weld and help position the work in its new home in the coming weeks.

The artist writes: "My art is guided by the concepts of journey and

transformation..." and explores the question "How can we tangibly represent the invisible connections between the human soul and the landscapes and objects around us?"

Stevens has exhibited at several museums nationally and in Nepal as part of a Fulbright Award.

NEW EXHIBITIONS

The galleries will be changed out at the start of the year to present two in-house collection based exhibitions opening on January 15 and an artist-in-residence show, which will open on January 11.

Indigenous American Art, 1960-2000, showcases Indigenous artists whose work blends contemporary art sensibilities with traditional cultural elements. *Animals!* will present the diversity of the natural world, in a lighthearted exhibit for the whole family.

Roswell artist-in-Residence Justin Richel explores the art and artifice inherent in the medium of painting through the combined practice of sculpture and painting. Richel received a BFA from Maine College of Art and later studied the technique of icon painting at the Franciscan Monastery in Kennebunk, Maine. His work is held in the collections of the Portland Museum of Art (ME), the John Michael Kohler Art Center (WI) and Fidelity Investments (MA), and he has exhibited at several institutions, primarily in the Northeast.

RMAC PUZZLE ROOM EXTENDED

The RMAC Puzzle Room: A RAiR Secret is open once again along with the Museum's reopening. The activity has been extended through February. The fee is \$5 per person and the

activity will accommodate 3-5 players. Precautions have been taken to ensure there is little to touch, and the space will be disinfected between groups. To make a reservation, please call 624-6744.

MEMBERSHIP CAMPAIGN

A promotional series of videos will be released December 14-18 as part of "Membership Week" to recognize the benefits of being a member and the impact of RMAC for the community. Members that stop by during our open hours that week, December 15-18, 1-5 pm will also receive a small, locally-made gift courtesy of the RMAC Foundation. Members are eligible for store discounts all month.

A digital newsletter will be released in December while the printed newsletter, the *Museum Magazine*, is currently on hold. The digital "e-news" will subsequently serve as an ongoing supplement to our print materials to better reach our online community in the future.

VIRTUAL PROGRAMMING

In the month of November there were 32 posts on Facebook; 10,450 accounts reached; 53 shares and 333 likes. A special edition of Kids Craft Corner provided a Thanksgiving family activity and reached 550 accounts.

RECENT MUSEUM ACTIVITIES & HIGHLIGHTS

SECOND SATURDAY

As part of the new admissions program, Roswell residents are free on the second Saturday of each month. As such, RMAC will be expanding its hours to include second Saturdays from 10 am to 3 pm. The Museum will continue to remain closed on other Saturdays due to resource limitations during COVID.

NEW EXHIBITIONS

Three galleries changed over recently and are now presenting two collections-based exhibits: *Indigenous American Art, 1960-2000* and *Animals!*.

Roswell Artist-in-Residence Justin Richel's exhibit – titled *A Window, A Door, A Ladder* – explores the art and artifice inherent in the medium of painting through amazingly realistic sculptures comprised of mixed media, paint and hand-stretched canvases. Made to look like actual materials and tools used in fine art and house painting, the hybrid paintings/sculptures draw from the historical tradition of trompe l'oeil, which translates from French to "deceive the eye."

MUSEUM STORE SALE

The Museum Store is holding a sale this month in preparation for a change in merchandise. The Store is open during current Museum hours from Tuesday to Friday, 1-5

MEMBERSHIP CAMPAIGN

As part of an ongoing Membership Campaign, Events and Communications Coordinator Wendy Cook conceived and led a project to present a week of online videos in December in collaboration with the Public Affairs Department to promote the value of memberships. Twenty-one community members participated in providing brief commentary re-enforcing the value of the Museum and having art, history and science in our lives. In-person store discounts and daily drawings complemented the week, which served as a replacement for the Museum's Holiday Open House.

A follow-up membership promotion mailing is being planned along with a digital campaign to take place in the coming weeks.

DIGITAL NEWSLETTERS

The first digital e-newsletter was released mid-December, reaching 275 accounts. The newsletter will continue to act as a temporary replacement to the printed quarterly newsletter, while hours and events are difficult to confirm in advance.

VIRTUAL PROGRAMMING

In the month of December there were 34 posts on Facebook; 14,213 accounts reached; 88 shares and 233 likes. Membership Week video reached 3,960 accounts.
