

ORDINANCE NO. 275.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 32 OF ORDINANCE NO. 254 OF THE CITY OF ROSWELL.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROSWELL:-

SECTION I.


That Section 32 of Ordinance No. 254 of the City of Roswell, New Mexico, entitled "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SPEED OF MOTOR VEHICLES AND OTHER VEHICLES; DEFINING CERTAIN TERMS, AND DEFINING THE ROAD LAW OF THE CITY OF ROSWELL, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES", passed and approved July 1, 1913, be, and the same hereby is, amended so as to read as follows:-

"Section 32. Every automobile operated or driven upon the streets, avenues or other public places within the city of Roswell, New Mexico, shall be provided with brakes in good working order, and sufficient to control such vehicle at all times, and a suitable bell, horn or other signaling device, and shall, during the period from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise, display at least two lighted lamps on the front, and one on the rear of such vehicle, and every motor cycle shall, between the hours aforesaid, carry at least one light on the front thereof. And it shall be unlawful for any motor vehicle to be operated or driven in or upon any of the streets, avenues or other public places in the City of Roswell, without having conspicuously displayed on the rear thereof a State number assigned to such vehicle by the Secretary of State, as provided by Chapter 19 of the Session Laws of New Mexico of 1913."

SECTION II.


This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after five days after its legal publication; and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.


