

ORDINANCE NO. 799

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 3 OF ARTICLE I, CHAPTER 2 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ROSWELL, NEW MEXICO 1952; PRESCRIBING THE BOUNDARIES OF CERTAIN WARDS WITHIN THE CITY OF ROSWELL; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT HEREWITH; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROSWELL,
NEW MEXICO:

1. That Section 3 of Article I, Chapter 2 of the Code of the City of Roswell, New Mexico, be, and the same hereby is, amended to read as follows, to-wit:

Section 3. City Wards.

The City of Roswell is hereby divided into five wards to be known respectively as the first, second, third, fourth and fifth wards. The boundary lines of such wards are described as follows:

Ward No. 1 shall be bounded on the north by the City limits; on the east by the City limits; on the south by Fifth Street extended to Atkinson Avenue, thence south along Atkinson Avenue to Second Street extended to the City limits; and on the west by Kentucky Avenue extended to the city limits.

Ward No. 2 shall be bounded on the north by the City limits; on the east by Kentucky Avenue extended to the City limits; on the south by Fifth Street extended to Union Avenue, thence south along Union Avenue to Alameda Street extended to the City limits; and on the west by the city limits.

Ward No. 3 shall be bounded on the north by Fifth Street extended to ~~the~~ Union Avenue, thence south along Union Avenue to Alameda Street extended to the City limits; on the east by Main Street; on the south by McGaffey Street extended to the City limits; and on the west by the City limits.

Ward No. 4 shall be bounded on the north by McGaffey Street extended to the City limits; on the east by Main Street extended to the City limits; on the south by the City limits; and on the west by the City limits.

Ward No. 5 shall be bounded on the north by Fifth Street extended to Atkinson Avenue, thence south along Atkinson Avenue to Second Street extended to the city limits; on the east by the City limits; on the south by the City limits; and on the west by Main Street.

2. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency. This repealer shall not be construed to revive any ordinance or part of any ordinance heretofore repealed.

3. That if any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance

shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not effect any other part of this ordinance.

4. That this ordinance is necessary for the preservation of the public health, peace, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Roswell, Chaves County, New Mexico, and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure on the ground of urgent public need; and therefore, immediately upon its final passage, shall be recorded in the book of ordinances of said City kept for that purpose, authenticated by the signatures of the Mayor and City Clerk, shall be published in the Roswell Daily Record, a legal newspaper, published and of general circulation in said City, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect five days after such publication.


