

RESOLUTION NO. 13-22

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF ROSWELL, NEW MEXICO STATING SUPPORT OF THE MAINSTREET ROSWELL PROGRAM BY PROVIDING THE REQUESTED FUNDING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SIGN THE BIENNIAL MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE NEW MEXICO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT**

**WHEREAS**, the New Mexico MainStreet Program is the affiliated "State Coordinating" program of the National Trust Main Street Center; and

**WHEREAS**, the New Mexico MainStreet Program, hosted through the New Mexico Economic Development Department, wishes to enter into Memorandums of Understanding with certain municipalities that foster community economic development by supporting downtown business district revitalization that is based upon the Main Street Four-Point Approach as its framework; and

**WHEREAS**, Roswell's MainStreet Program has been in existence for 23 years, since January 1989, making it one of the first MainStreet Programs in New Mexico; and

**WHEREAS**, the MainStreet Roswell Program has taken a lead position in the creation of the Downtown Master Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, the Governing Body of the City of Roswell supports the continued efforts of the MainStreet Roswell Program and agrees to abide by the eligibility and participation requirements; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Roswell supports the vision, principles and values of comprehensive district revitalization and has budgeted thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) for each of the past six years.


**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ROSWELL, NEW MEXICO that:** the Mayor be authorized to sign the Biennial Memorandum of Understanding with the New Mexico MainStreet Program, a program of the New Mexico Economic Development Department; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that:** the City of Roswell has budgeted thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) as pledged support in fiscal year 2014 to contract with the MainStreet Roswell Program to work on the City's behalf in community economic development efforts in downtown. Subject to the availability of funds in future years, this level of support is not planned to be changed.
