

RESOLUTION NO. 1955

A RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE CITY ENGINEER TO PREPARE, SUBMIT AND FILE WITH THE CITY CLERK CERTAIN PRELIMINARY PLANS, ESTIMATE OF COST, AND AN ASSESSMENT PLAT SETTING FORTH THE BASIS FOR ASSESSMENT, ALL IN CONNECTION WITH THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT AND CONSTRUCTION OF CERTAIN STREETS, CURBS, AND GUTTERS, AND OTHER IMPROVEMENTS, AND PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 3-33-1 THROUGH 3-33-43 INCLUSIVE, NEW MEXICO STATUTES, 1978, AND LAWS AMENDATORY THEREOF AND SUPPLEMENTAL THERETO.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Roswell is of the opinion that the interest of said City requires West Country Club Road, from North Main Street to Montana Avenue be graded, compacted, paved, drained, curbed, guttered, and otherwise improved; and

WHEREAS, for the purpose of designation and identification it is desirable that the streets described herein be known and identified as "ROSWELL, NEW MEXICO, PAVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 1985-2."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY, THE CITY COUNCIL, OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF THE CITY OF ROSWELL, NEW MEXICO that:

1. The City Engineer, a competent engineer, duly licensed as an Engineer under the laws of the State of New Mexico is hereby directed to prepare, submit, and file with the City Clerk preliminary plans showing typical sections of the contemplated improvements, the type or types of materials, approximate thickness and width, and preliminary estimate of the cost of the grading, compacting, paving, drainage, curbing, guttering, and otherwise improving the streets herein above noted.

2. The City Engineer is hereby directed to estimate the cost of each of the types of construction showing quantities, unit cost, and total cost. Said preliminary estimate of the cost shall also include, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the advertising, appraising, engineering, printing, legal and such other work or improvement and the payment of the cost thereof.

3. The City Engineer is hereby directed to prepare, submit, and file with the City Clerk an assessment plat showing the area to be assessed and the amount of the maximum benefits estimated to be assessed against each tract or parcel of land in said assessment area (i.e., against the property benefitting from said improvements), on a front foot basis: provided that an equitable adjustment will be made for assessments levied against any irregular lots or lands and made for any tract or parcel not specially benefitted by any improvement, so that the assessments according to benefits are equal and uniform.
