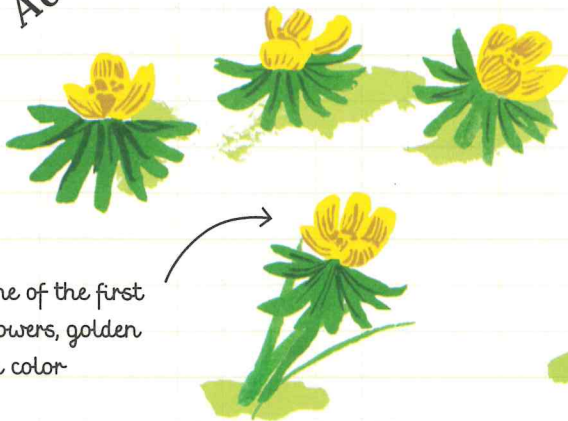


# Can you spot . . . spring flowers?

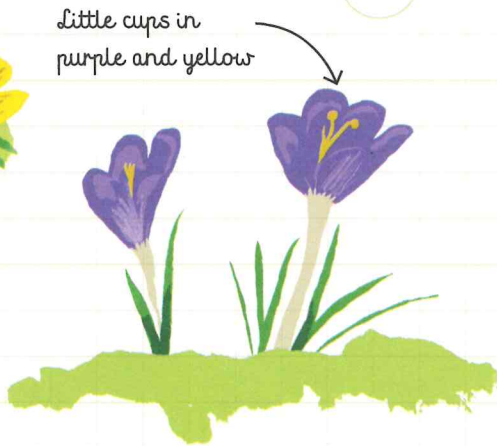

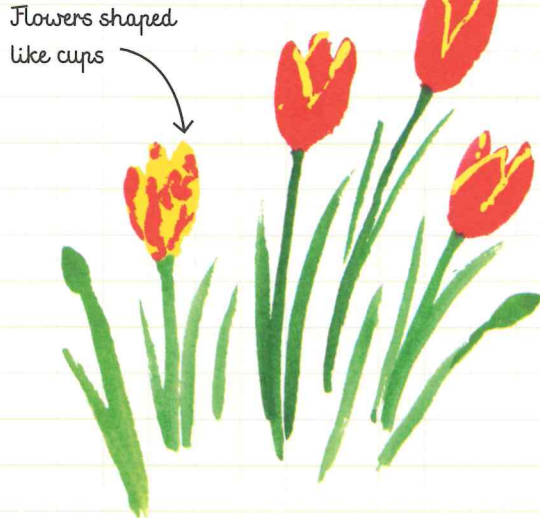
One of the first flowers, golden in color

Crocuses



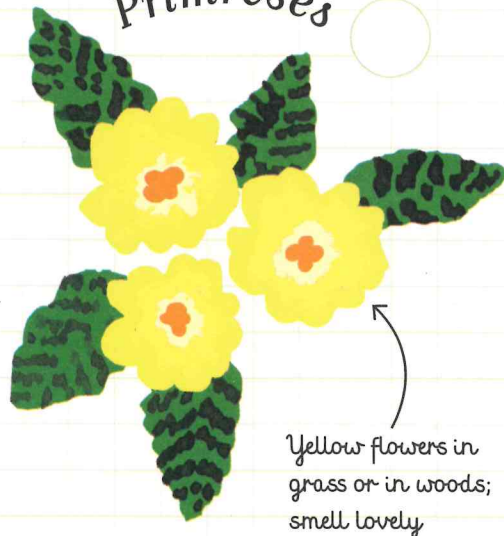
Little cups in purple and yellow

Wild garlic



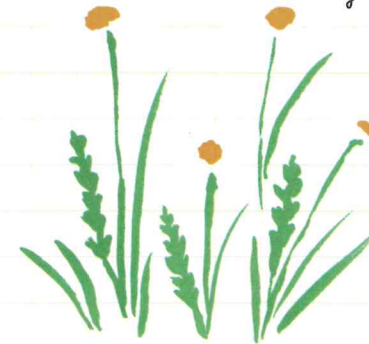
Strong-smelling white flowers
